Connected conservation: History and management at the Arctic and National Elk Refuges

The Arctic Refuge and the National Elk Refuge are two crown jewels of the National Wildlife Refuge System. They represent an evolution of conservation thinking, and their histories are closely linked by Olaus and Margaret Murie – the famous conservation couple that made their home in Jackson Hole. Each refuge faces profound threats in the coming decade. Successful management will require a continued program of sound science but also, perhaps, a change of attitude.
