Rooted in restoration: Collaborative sagebrush management practices and strategies

Sagebrush habitat restoration represents an essential land management strategy for a biome that has shrunk to half its original area across the American West. Grand Teton National Park has restored 1,500 acres of sagebrush habitat since 2009, learning lessons and adapting practices along the way. Park ecologists collaborate with University of Wyoming researchers to understand drivers of restoration outcomes and techniques to optimize success.
